

Owl's Class Trip to Bristol



The Owls really enjoyed their trip to Bristol to see the SS Great Britain. First we explored the historic dockyard and headed beneath the glass sea into the dry dock where we saw the propeller and hull of the ship up close. During our workshop, 'Victorians at Sea', we learnt about how long journeys took in the SS Great Britain and took part in a range of activities that would have kept the Victorians entertained. We tried out dip pens, played Victorian games, enjoyed looking at flick books, drew our silhouettes, explored shadow puppets, dressed up as Victorians and learnt about Victorian artefacts. After the workshop, the children really enjoyed exploring the SS Great Britain...although some of the smells and sounds were all too realistic including a Victorian who had been sick in a bucket! We also spotted the Clifton Suspension Bridge while we were on the bus.
