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It's been fantastic to have so many of you join us for parent consultations this week. I know it can be extremely difficult to juggle school commitments with busy work schedules. If you were unable to meet with us this week but would like to have a chat with your child's teacher please call the school and we can arrange a meeting or phone call.

Children make the best progress when there is good communication between the school and their carers. It enables us to work as a team and provide greater consistency for the children in our care.

On the topic of good communication, I have an important date for your diaries. December 14th is the day of the KS1 and KS2 Christmas play. There will be a matinee at 2pm and an evening performance at 5:15pm. Unfortunately, we can't start any later as the village hall has another booking in the evening.

Ladybirds are doing a separate play in Beaford Church. Mr Northmore is meeting Reverend Ally to arrange a date which we'll announce next week.

Last weekend, myself and some of the children went with the TEAM multi-academy trust to watch Wales play Barbarians at the Principality Stadium in Cardiff. It was a great day out, a high scoring game and a great atmosphere with 50,000 fans (and one very excited Mr Mathew Harts) cheering on Alun Wyn Jones and Liegh Halfpenny in their final appearances before retirement.





We are also very proud of some of our children that represented Torrington Beavers and Cubs at a Royal British Legion event on Sunday 29th Oct. It was a service dedicated to the new Standard-Flag that was last changed 100 years ago. Milo, Rala, Fred and Joe were professional and respectful throughout as they marched holding the flags alongside many other organisations. I'm told there are spaces available at Torrington Cubs on Tuesday nights for children aged 8-11.

In school this week, we've prepared the children for Remembrance Sunday with discussions in class, an assembly and we held a 2 minutes silence on Friday morning. Next week is Anti-bullying week. To show their support for the cause, children can wear odd socks on Monday 13th and we'll have a week of activities that develop children's understanding of bullying and how to prevent it.

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Owls

Thank you to everyone who has handed in their home-learning from last Thursday. We have had some really high quality outcomes! Well done Owls! This week, the children have been learning short division first using images of place value counters to support their understanding and then with numbers. In English, the children have been reading War Game and watching the animation. They have been building their understanding of WW1 and using this to learn about quotes and relative clauses. In computing, the children were exploring online databases.

Otters

Otters have had another excellent week. We have been working very hard on our writing, developing the skills we need for our adventure stories. We used drama to help us get ideas for our writing. In maths, we have continued our multiplication and division sequence by using our knowledge of times tables to help us solve problems. In history, we researched everyday life in Ancient Rome and in RE we produced some Hindu hand art to help us learn about Diwali.

Hedgehogs

Hedgehogs have been using their design ideas to help them to make their moon buggies this week. The children have been evaluating their work each lesson. They have learned some more facts about Yuri Gagarin and the eight planets that make up the solar system. The children have created character descriptions for their main character that will feature in their space story. The Year One children have been looking at addition problems and the Year Two children have come up with strategies to help them with their adding.

In Ladybirds this week, we began the week looking at fireworks. The children made edible sparklers with Rachel on Wednesday, they seemed very yummy! During maths, we have continued to look at


