Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for your support with the school closure yesterday. Everyone I spoke to was very understanding about the situation. Closing schools is not a decision the Team Multi Academy Trust lightly. On Wednesday afternoon, we received the advice from Devon County Council to close schools as storm Ciarán posed a threat to life. We children informed the and contacted parents as quickly as possible. Staff then planned some home learning activities. I took the decision to leave home learning at your discretion because I know how difficult it is to balance home learning and home working.

When you receive the advice to shut the school, I always feel a 'better safe than sorry' approach is called for. Fortunately, the storm didn't affect us as badly as was forecast and I hope everyone's loved ones and property were safe.

Even though the cross-country event was cancelled on Thursday, there's still been a lot going on this week. All the children had cricket workshops on Tuesday, run by the Chance to Shine charity. Martin Brice, an experienced cricket coach, came and taught the children the basics of bowling,

fielding and batting. Martin will be with us for the next two Tuesdays so remember to prepare for PE on those days.

Wednesday's assembly was on the history of Bonfire Night. I was very impressed with the children's prior knowledge and unsurprisingly, most of the questions in the assembly were trying to find out as many gruesome details of Guy Fawkes' torture – I wish I'd prepared better, as I didn't have a minute by minute account of the interrogation! There have also been fire safety talks at the school this week in preparation for the weekend's celebrations.

On Saturday, I'll be going with the children to watch Wales vs Barbarians at the Principality stadium. Next week, Reverend Ally is in to talk about Remembrance Sunday and hold a two minutes silence on Friday 10th at Ilam. Owls This week, the children have started to explore newspaper reports and the language used within them. We have looked at subordinating conjunctions (if, since, as, when, although, while, after, before, until, because) and how to use these to extend sentences as well as how to punctuate the sentence with a comma if we start our sentence with a subordinating conjunction. In maths, we have learnt how to multiply 3 digit numbers by a 1 digit number using a formal method for multiplication. In PSHE, we discussed the idea of 'being normal' and how there are different perceptions about what normal means and how important it was to celebrate the differences we have.

Otters have come back to school with an excellent attitude towards their learning. We are lucky at the moment to have a cricket coach on Tuesdays. This week we worked hard at coordination and bowling skills. In maths we started our multiplication and division sequence and have been using arrays to help us. In our writing we are learning the skills we need

Hedgehogs

Hedgehogs have been introduced to our new topic, 'Moon Zoom'. They have discussed their prior knowledge on space and have joined in with some counting space rhymes. The children have carried out some moon buggy research and decided on their design ideas in preparation of making their own. They have started their learning on everyday materials in science and have grouped their coats into different catergories. Hedgehogs have been introduced to their English text, 'Toys in Soace' by Mini Grey. They have even ended off the week with a fire safety talk.

Our week this week has surrounded ourselves in Autumn. The children have been busy creating Autumn trees, using different autumnal items to print and working on their pattern skills.

We have looked at 'The Squirrels Who Squabbled' as our inspiration for our Literacy learning, discussing the characters in the book. In Maths, the reception children have been using more or fewer to describe groups of things, while the pre-school children have been practicing counting to 5.




