This week, the children have started to explore newspaper reports and the language used within them. We have looked at subordinating conjunctions (if, since, as, when, although, while, after, before, until, because) and how to use these to extend sentences as well as how to punctuate the sentence with a comma if we start our sentence with a subordinating conjunction. In maths, we have learnt how to multiply 3 digit numbers by a 1 digit number using a formal method for multiplication. In PSHE, we discussed the idea of 'being normal' and how there are different perceptions about what normal means and how important it was to celebrate the differences we have.



Otters

Otters have had a busy week. We had our last cricket session and we have worked very hard to build our writing skills so that we are ready to write our adventure stories. We have worked on writing speech and using adjectives and similes. In maths we are getting to the end of our multiplication and division sequence while in RE we learned about Hindu gods and goddesses. In science we thought about the source of different sounds and learned how sound travel to our ears.



Hedgehogs

Hedgehogs have been investigating which materials are waterproof in science. They used their observations to think about a suitable space suit for an alien to wear. The children thought carefully about their knowledge of properties. Hedgehogs have been learning about subtraction in maths and have used counting back, crossing out and the number line to help them. Their space stories are developing and the children are using their planning and story language for support. Next week the children will be filming some of their moon buggies.

Ladybirds

Ladybirds have had a fabulous week, learning lots about hibernation, keeping our environment clear of rubbish and learning about Diwali. We have begun to use 5 frames for our maths this week, this is to develop our understanding of adding one more, along with reasoning the order of number from 1-5. As we move into next week, we will start to have a focus for our Nativity! Details will be communicated separately.
