Dear Parents

I hope you all had a wonderful Christmas. It was so nice to see all the children on Wednesday and hear about visits from family, friends and Father Christmas.

The staff were in on January 2nd for an Inset day, which focussed on teaching phonics. Phonics is an integral part of our early reading strategy, it teaches children to decode written words into speech so needs regular review. Ladybirds are holding an open morning on Wednesday 17th January to show parents how we teach phonics and early maths. If your child is in Nursery or Reception please come if you are available.

Mr Northmore has been very busy the last few weeks organising specialist PE coaches to come and train the children. I'm pleased to announce that on Friday afternoons we have a tennis specialist from ARK in Bideford coming to teach the children and football coaches from Exeter City Football Club. These PE sessions are alongside the children's normal PE lessons. This half term, Owls have football on Fridays and Otters tennis. After half term, Hedgehogs have football and Ladybirds tennis. If your child has football boots, they can bring them in on Fridays but trainers are fine if they do not.

In other news, Airband Broadband are planning some work on the Beaford to Torrington section of the A3124 in the coming weeks. We are in communication with them to ensure this causes as little disruption to school drop offs and pick ups as possible.

All the staff are looking forward to the new term and we'll keep you updated about the many exciting things that happen at Beaford in 2024.

This week, the Owls have been very engaged with our new topic, 'Sow, Grow and Farm'. They have explored Google Earth and looked at the different landscapes around the world and we discussed how the climate and soil enables certain food/crops to grow well i.e. orange trees in Calfornia and coffee beans in South America. The children then screen shot an aerial view of a landscape that interested them and overlay a bird outline in Google Drawings. Owls then explored collage techniques to recreate the bird's eye view and wrote a descriptive piece of writing in 1st person about what the bird saw. They also have enjoyed using watercolour techniques to paint fruit and vegetables seen in allotments/gardens around the UK.

Otters

Otters have had a fantastic first few days of term and have settled in very well. We have got started with our new topic which is Rocks, Relics and Rumbles. We have started learning about the structure of the Earth and have also been working on our sketching skills so that we can draw ammonite fossils. In maths we learned how to multiply by 10, and in English we have been thinking about the features of information texts. Next week we will start swimming for Year 3 on Thursdays and PE for everyone on Fridays.



Hedgehogs

Hedgehogs have started their topic 'Great Scott!'.

They have located Antarctica on the globe and a map.

They have looked at photos to gain some background knowledge about the continent. The children have read interesting facts about Emperor penguins and got into role as penguins 'in a huddle'. We started our first Gymnastics lesson and the children got into different shapes and put their shapes together into simple routines.



Ladybirds

We have had a great few days back, settling back into school and our routines. This term's topic is called, 'Let's Investigate' where we will be exploring the world of animals. Minibeasts, to under the sea and dinosaurs. This children will be discovering lots about their environment, so any support you can help with would be greatly appreciated. Our focus story next week is, 'We are going on a bear hunt.'




