The children have been playing on the grass a lot more and I've seen some excellent den building and creative games played with our tarpaulins.

Our first ever Opal certificate was handed out in celebration assembly last week. Last Friday, we had our first tennis and football sessions that are running until the end of the year. The football session was six different activities that the Owls did on a rotation. I got involved in a penalty shoot out but the less said about that the better!

It was so nice to see so many parents there and the children did an amazing job of showing off all their hard work on their reading. OWIS e Owls have star

This week, the Owls have started looking at a new text called 'Tower to the Sun' and thought about how the author makes it an effective text. In maths, we have been learning how to subtract fractions and convert mixed number fractions to improper fractions. In science, we explored opaque, transparent and translucent and used torches to test whether objects were translucent or opaque. We also looked at how shadows change depending on where the light source is. In music, the children have really got into our unit 'Disco Fever' and requested to dance as well as sing the song. They showcased a variety of fantastic



Otters

Otters have had a brilliant week. We have been learning to accompany a song using glockenspiels in music and in French we are practising how to introduce ourselves and ask simple questions. In maths we have moved on to column method multiplication. In English we have been exploring information texts linked to our topic. Otters are now experts about different types of rock and how fossils are formed. Improving out tennis skills is an excellent way to finish the week, despite the cold!





Hedgehogs

Hedgehogs have been researching facts on Antarctica this week. They have looked at non-fiction books, fact files and pictures to help them. The children have recorded their sentences on their mind map and talked through their sentences verbally. In maths Y2 have continued to calculate with money and have enjoyed combining different combinations of coins. Year One children have created a 'human number line' and marked numbers on blank number lines. In Science they have compared animals found in polar habitats and learned about how they are suited to their environment. In RE the children have acted out the story of 'The crying camel and what it means to Muslims.



This week, it started with a roarsome book based on underpants and dinosaurs! The children have been discovering about lands of dinosaurs, creating them using salt dough, different 2D shapes and labelling them independently in their learning. Some of them have also begun drawing their own and writing their names in their independent time. We will be continuing our dinosaur theme and discover more about fossils and bones.

Should I keep my

child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics



but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
