Dear Parents

We've had another great week at Beaford and the children are really in the flow of this term's curriculum. We started the week with an assembly on building learning power. At Beaford we teach the children that learning is not just the responsibility of the teachers but also of the children. If they can develop the 4 areas of building learning power they will find learning new things much easier. The four areas Perseverance. are: Working Well Thinking, Together, Curiosity. This week's assembly was all about Perseverance.

During my career in education I've seen many examples where the children that do well at school are not the ones that are what we'd traditionally call intelligent. But the ones that have the emotional resilience and attitude to learning that means they constantly develop, try new things and never give up. Educational studies have proven this too. As the educational saying goes: "Hard work beats talent when talent doesn't work hard." All the staff at Beaford praise the effort the children put into their learning and not just their outcomes.

Alice Bolton, one of our school ambassadors has been inspired by the BBC Big Birdwatch and has taken it upon herself to collect money for the RSPB next week. She will be selling badges for the charity. If your child would like one please bring in £1.

Owls

This week Owls have been learning to multiply fractions by integers (whole numbers). They have been thinking about using bar models and numberlines to support their understanding and have understood that it's just the numerator that changes while the denominator stays the same. In English, we have been thinking about what effect a text can have on the reader and thinking about how The Tower to the Sun may insight change into the reader by encouraging them to think about the environment. In Science, the children enjoyed planning and carrying out an investigation about how the distance from a light source affects the size of the

shadow.

Hedgehogs

Hedgehogs have been researching facts on Antarctica this week. They have looked at non-fiction books, fact files and pictures to help them. The children have recorded their sentences on their mind map and talked through their sentences verbally. In maths Y2 have continued to calculate with money and have enjoyed combining different combinations of coins. Year One children have created a 'human number line' and marked numbers on blank number lines. In Science they have compared animals found in polar habitats and learned about how they are suited to their environment. In RE the children have acted out the story of 'The crying camel' and what it means to Muslims.

Otters

Otters have had another busy week including developing our ideas for our information texts in English and learning about fossil formation in science. In maths we have been working on dividing a 2digit number by a 1-digit number. In RE we performed drama to help us learn about Jesus and the first disciples. In music we have been learning how to accompany a song with instruments and sing at the same time as part of our "playing in a band" sequence. Year 3 enjoyed swimming and the whole class have been developing their tennis skills.



Ladybirds

It has been lovely this week to watch the children really immerse themselves in the world of dinosaurs. We have been looking at different non-fiction texts where we are gathering information and facts, rather than a story. We have looked at different habitats, dinosaur names, what they eat along with creating our own fossils and hatching our own dinosaurs! In our maths we have looked at adding numbers to 10, with the children finding parts to make the whole. The Nursery children have been busy to, they have continued their learning around bears and where they come from. They have also set up at travel agents where they have been busy mark making in their passports and creating pictures of where they would like to go. These next 2 weeks we will be exploring zoos and where animals come from.

Ladybirds Nursery

Our roleplay has been a travel agents this week, we have been looking at different wild animals and exploring the countries they live in. The travel agents has developed lots of mark making with the nursery children.

Measles Outbreaks

There have been recent localised outbreaks of measles centred around the West Midlands. There is a risk of further outbreaks in other areas unless urgent action is taken to increase Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccination take up in areas with low MMR vaccine rates. Measles spreads very easily among those who are unvaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools. The best protection against measles for children and adults is to get both doses of the MMR vaccine. It is never too late to have these vaccinations.

On the day that your child has PE, please make sure they come to school in their PE Kits and have a change of clothes should they need them.


