This week Hedgehogs had a great experience at Rosemoor exploring how plants grow. This trip helped to enrich our science curriculum and was a great learning experience for the children. Owls

"This week the children in Owls have been learning about decimals in maths. They've learnt to recognise tenths, hundredths and thousandths in the place value system and to represent them as fractions. In English, the have started to write a nonchronological report on Dragons. In Pe, they had their first basketball lesson and learnt dribbling skills. For Religion the children have been learning about the importance of Easter to Christians and acted out sections of the Easter story as shown in the photos.

Hedgehogs

Hedgehogs have immersed themselves into their new topic, 'The Scented Garden'. They went to Rosemoor on Tuesday and looked at seed germination, planted their own pea seeds and went on a plant discovery walk. They have been sketching camellias and daffodils in art and have learned some new techniques when making observational drawings. Hedgehogs have looked at how we pay attention to details, texture and scale. In maths the children have enjoyed some length investigations and have been thinking carefully about their explanations.



Otters

Otters have had a very busy week back from the holiday . In our topic we have been learning about where in the world there are major mountain ranges. We have been learning how to perform poetry and starting to write our own shape poems (calligrams). In maths we have been learning to measure and compare lengths. In RE we used drama to learn the story of Easter and in computing we have started writing our own computer code. We are continuing our French with a new sequence of learning which features real French speakers! Well done Otters for an excellent first week of the new half term!



Ladybirds

In Ladybirds this week it has been creepy and crawly as the children have begun their learning about bugs and minibeasts. We have discussed what makes a bug a certain type of bug, where we can find them, how they help us and have also learned a song based on the body parts of an insect. We have been creating our own bugs using our junk modelling and overcoming obstacles along the way. The nursery children have also created their own Andy's adventure HQ in the role play areas where they are off on adventures researching different bugs and insects. 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30 Hours/Working Entitlement Funding



IMPORTANT MESSAGE – DO NOT MISS OUT ON WORKING ENTITLEMENT FUNDING!

The working entitlement funding for 2, 3 and 4 year-olds is available for eligible families. It is important that if you have a child who will be 2 or 3 years old before 31st March or if your circumstances have changed, that you apply to HMRC (Childcare Service) now.

Please set-up or visit your <u>Gateway Account</u> immediately to apply or reconfirm. If you are unsure if you are entitled to the working entitlement, please check the <u>Eligibility Criteria</u>.

It is important that you allow good time as any queries with new applications or reconfirmations could cause delays and any codes issued in April 2024 will not be funded in summer term 2024. Any start dates from 1st April 2024 will not be funded until autumn term 2024 and only then if you reconfirm by 31st August 2024.

If you have a code that needs to be reconfirmed, this should also be completed now, and if you are unsure, it is your responsibility to log into your Gateway Account and check. If you are newly eligible or are given a new code at reconfirmation, you need to take your 11-digit code to your provider who will complete a verification check and then confirm your funded space.

When eligibility ends, children who have accessed the working entitlement can continue to access their entitlement in the grace period. However, new children, who are 2 or 3 years old before 31st March, or start at a new setting, cannot start to use the working entitlement funding in the grace period if they are no longer eligible.

As part of the eligibility check with HMRC, you will be asked if you would like to register for Tax Free Childcare. You cannot register for Tax Free Childcare if you are in receipt of Universal Credit, Tax Credits or Childcare Vouchers. If you do register, your benefits may be stopped, and it can take several weeks to reinstate.

If you have problems accessing the system or completing your check, please call the HMRC Helpdesk on 0300 1234 097 (your provider and Devon County Council cannot assist with new applications or reconfirmations).
