Ladybirds had a further treat on Thursday with a school trip to Exmoor Zoo! This linked into their learning this term about habitats. The children had a talk on animal's diets and were able to apply their learning in class to classify the animals they saw. Ladybird's parents look out for some David Attenboroughesque knowledge about nocturnal animals, how animals use camouflage and whether

animals are herbivores or camivores. I'd like to thank Mr Northmore for organising such a wonderful experience and to all the parents that volunteered to come on the trip. We literally could not have done it without you and it was such a memorable and engaging experience for the children.



Otters

Otters have had another productive week. In geography we made our own miniature hills and mountains and learned about how elevation is shown as contour lines on a map. In RE we completed our Easter topic by learning about Palm Sunday. We tried some creative writing and also worked hard to improve our understanding of adverbials and the present perfect tense. In PE we began moving towards playing a full game of hockey. Year 3 mathematicians have been looking at different ways to represent fractions and Year 4s have been learning about mixed numbers and improper fractions.





Hedgehogs

Hedgehogs were joined by Ladybirds to watch a fantastic performance called 'Storm in a Teapot' on Monday. They listened attentively and participated so well with the songs, dances and chants. The children have enjoyed making Easter gardens as part of their RE learning this week- they were very creative! In Maths Hedgehogs have explored the volume of water held in different sized containers as part of their unit on capacity. They enjoyed finding measurements such as 100ml and 500ml and compared their findings.

Wow! What a week in Ladybirds. We first had storm in a teacup come in and deliver a show for us, focusing on our word choices, what a good story needs and that we all have our own stories inside us. Then we've had a busy week of learning, writing a new ending to the snail and the whale, using our new 'Make-do' tools to create ourselves a ship at first, but soon a submarine so that we could help in our aquarium role play. We've then had an incredible trip to Exmoor Zoo, where the children were able to look at many different animals, talking about their habitats, what they eat and some species that they belong to. 


Attendance This Week
