



Reading:

Whole class reading:

Each day we read and examine a text together. This includes Mr Wright reading the text to the class, children reading aloud and independently. We discuss questions as a class and then work in pairs or individually.

Class book:

We also read a class story related to our topic. This will include *The Magic and the Mummy*.

English:

Narrative writing

We will be writing a setting narrative based on sea adventures. To support our writing we will immerse ourselves in our text, *The Whale*.



We will use role play and poetry to build ideas before we write. We will learn the skills of show-not-tell, setting description and consider how to produce powerful descriptive writing.



Maths:

We follow the mixed year 3 and 4 White Rose curriculum and this term will be learning about:

- Place value in numbers up to 10,000
- Partitioning numbers up to 10,000
- Representing numbers in different ways
- Ordering numbers
- Estimating numbers
- Rounding numbers

Rivers around the world.

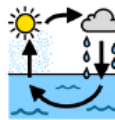
