Thank you for your time this week. It was so nice to see you all at parent consultations. Good communication between school and parents is such a vital part of ensuring children get consistent messages that help them learn. It's also a great opportunity to take on your feedback to best adapt our practice to your children. If you were unable to attend or haven't booked a meeting please contact the school or talk to your child's teacher to arrange a time to meet this term.

This year, we've been looking to increase the opportunities for children to perform. This week we had a music focus in school and had some visitors from the trust in observing our music lessons. They were impressed with the provision provided in the lessons but also the extra touches that the staff at Beaford have added this year, such as children using musical instruments during OPAL, Ms Cannon running a very popular choir club during Thursday lunchtimes and our weekly singing assembly.



In terms of performances, Hedgehog's much anticipated assembly is coming up next Friday and we'd love parents to join if you can. We've also started planning our Christmas play. Like last year, Ladybirds will do a separate performance in the village church on Wednesday December 11th and the rest of the school will perform at the village hall on Thursday December 12th.



This week saw the start of coding club for Owls where the children are creating websites. Thank you to Saffron Murphy for volunteering to run the club. There was also the return of the drama and performing arts club for Otters and Owls, and it was amazing to see our Ladybirds and Hedgehogs take part in the football club on Monday.

On the theme of sports, selected children took part in the Team Multi-academy trust Cross Country event on Wednesday and all of them made the school proud with their hard work and iron-willed determination to cross the finish line.

Next week, we have organised a skateboarding and scooter workshop for the children, so please make sure children bring trainers in on Thursday 21st and on Tuesday 19th Ladybirds are looking forward to their science trip to RHS Rosemoor.

In Owls this week, the children have begun their new maths unit which focuses on fractions. They have looked at a fraction wall to find equivalent fractions as well as spotting the pattern that as long as the numerator and denominator are multiplied by the same number, the fraction will be equivalent. In science, the children looked at how to create circuit diagrams to represent circuits and they enjoyed having a go at making a series of circuits with a range of different components. In music, the children used crotchets, minims and semibreves in their compositions and confidently used 4 beats in each bar.

Hedgehogs

Hedgehogs have continued to impress with their commitment to our topic. The effort in our Gymnastics sessions is inspiring. The shapes and balances that the children are trying and holding is coming along nicely. Last week we watched some professional Gymnasts performing their routines and this has certainly helped the children to want tio improve their stretches, balances and posture! In Art this week, we have seen some beautiful, carefully drawn poppies. It is great to hear the children appraising their own and others artwork. In Music this week, the children have started to learn 'The Orchestra Song'. The children expressed themselves in different ways and have started to build up their knowledge of musical technical vocabulary.

Otters

Otters have had a busy week with our new maths sequence about multiplication and division. The children thought about what they know about already this topic before moving onto working with arrays. We have been moving quickly through our writing sequence about Jacques Cousteau by practising fronted adverbials, speech and emotive language. In topic we learned about the layers of the ocean, in music we are thinking about how music makes us feel at the same time as developing our ability to play instruments and sing. In art we have continued our work on Indian miniatures and in science we have developed our understanding of the properties of solids, liquids and gases. Well done Otters

In Ladybirds this week, our week has gone incredibly quickly. We have begun looking into autumnal changes and what it means to be in autumn. We went out into the community to find some different coloured leaves so we could create our own leaf fireplace. We have been looking and comparing shapes in our environment, looking and finding different forms of circles and triangles, using printing of 3D shapes to see what faces the shapes had. We have also created our own autumnal scenes where we have begun speaking about hibernating animals. Next week we are boarding a train towards the hibernation station. Choo Choo!

Applications for a School Place

When and how to apply for your child to start in the reception year at a primary school.

 Your child must be in full-time education at the beginning of the term following his or her fifth birthday. If your child was born between 1 September 2020 and 31 August 2021 they are due to start primary school in September 2025.

Applications for starting primary school in September 2025 open on 15 November 2024 and close on 15 January 2025.

Please make sure you apply for your place in good time to secure your preferred school. Applications can be made through the Citizens Portal




